Apprenticeship Week Wales 2025 - celebrating skills and opportunities

Apprenticeship Week Wales 2025 (AW2025) was a vibrant celebration of the impact apprenticeships have on individuals, businesses and the Welsh economy.

Across the Cardiff Capital Region (CCR) organisations including NTFW, Careers Wales, local authorities, Colegau Cymru, and the Welsh Government came together to highlight the diverse opportunities apprenticeships offer.



Showcasing apprenticeships at the Senedd

The Apprenticeship Fair at the Senedd, organised by the National Training Federation for Wales (NTFW) and Colegau Cymru, was a standout event of the week and was hosted by the cross-party group on apprenticeships, co-chaired by Luke Fletcher MS and Jovce Watson MS.

The event brought together apprentices, employers, training providers and policymakers to discuss the vital role apprenticeships play in developing a skilled workforce.

Vikki Howells, minister for further and higher education, addressed attendees, reinforcing the Welsh Government's commitment to preparing learners for the jobs of the future.

The event was attended by all 10 work-based learning contract commission holders, as well as representatives from Medr and the Welsh Government, demonstrating the strength of partnerships.

A joint statement from NTFW and Colegau Cymru reaffirmed the importance of apprenticeships in building a resilient and skilled workforce, calling for continued investment to meet Wales's ambitious targets.






Careers Wales: supporting young people into apprenticeships

With hundreds of apprenticeships available across 23 different sectors, Careers Wales encouraged young people to explore their options and gain valuable work experience.

Local authorities championing apprenticeships

Local authorities across the CCR actively promoted apprenticeship pathways throughout the week, highlighting success stories, recruitment opportunities, and career progression routes.



CCRSP Stakeholder Conference 2025 shaping the future of skills in Wales

This year's CCRSP Stakeholder Conference promises to be a key event in the ongoing development of skills strategies in Wales.



Due to be held in mid-May, this large-scale conference will bring together approximately 150 employers, stakeholders and providers to explore the latest skills policy and strategy. It will also celebrate the successes from the current Employment and Skills Plan 2022-25 and gather insights to inform future developments.

As we navigate a period of political transition ahead of the 2026 Senedd elections, this conference will provide a vital platform for dialogue between Welsh Government officials and the broader skills community.

Key themes will include the growing importance of green skills and the ongoing work to refresh the sector-driven activities that support Wales's future workforce. With input from organisations such as Welsh Government, Medr, and the CCR, the conference will feature keynote addresses from industry leaders, as well as running topical workshops that dive into some of the most pressing issues in the skills sector.

The conference will provide an opportunity to foster valuable exchanges between employers and stakeholders when shaping skills development across the region. It will also provide participants with a unique opportunity to engage directly with policymakers, share their insights, and play an active role when influencing positive change.



CCRSP roadshow events -engaging young people across the region

CCRSP is arranging a series of roadshow events in collaboration with further education institutions to engage young people across the region. These events target young people aged 16-24 and align with the Young Person's Guarantee focusing on fostering youth engagement.

The roadshows will take the form of five satellite seminars, each hosted at one of the region's five colleges. Each event will host around 30 attendees, creating an intimate and focused environment for meaningful engagement.

The events aim to provide an interactive information exchange where young people can learn about the wide range of opportunities available to them across the region - from education and training pathways to employment and career prospects. They will also provide valuable insights that will contribute to the refresh of the CCRSP Employment and Skills Plan, ensuring that the views and aspirations of younger generations are reflected in future policies and strategies.

By engaging directly with young people, the CCRSP seeks to create a platform for them to share their thoughts on the direction of the Plan, particularly regarding their specific needs and concerns. This will help inform the refresh and ensure that the Plan remains relevant and responsive to the changing needs of today's younger populations.

These events serve as a valuable follow-up to the larger CCRSP Stakeholder Conference - providing a broader platform for employers, stakeholders, and providers to discuss key policy developments and skills strategies.

Junior Chef Academy - inspiring future culinary talent in Wales

Aspiring young chefs in Wales are getting a taste of the culinary industry through the Junior Chef Academy.

The academy is a 10-week skills program designed for young people aged 14 to 16 and delivered in partnership by Compass Cymru, Cardiff and Vale College (CAVC), and Cardiff Commitment. The initiative provides hands-on training to develop essential kitchen skills and spark interest in careers within hospitality.

Held at Cardiff West Community High School, the program offers students a unique opportunity to work with professional chefs and learn vital skills such as food preparation, knife handling and kitchen safety.

The curriculum also emphasises sustainability, nutrition and the importance of using locally sourced ingredients.

The program culminates in a special showcase event at Cardiff City Stadium, where participants test their newly acquired skills by preparing a three-course meal for an audience of family members, industry professionals and local dignitaries.

The initiative aligns closely with the Cardiff Commitment's goal to provide young people with meaningful experiences that connect them to future career pathways.

By introducing students to the world of professional cooking, the Junior Chef Academy not only enhances their skills but also highlights the vast opportunities available within Wales's vibrant hospitality sector.

CCRSP update: Medr's strategic plan key developments

Medr, the body responsible for funding and regulating the tertiary education and research sector in Wales, has made significant progress in developing its five-year strategic plan which is aimed at strengthening the integration of tertiary education and research across Wales.

The plan, which was developed in consultation with partners across Wales, responds to the Welsh Government's statement of strategic priorities for tertiary education and research and innovation, while also addressing the requirements outlined in The Tertiary Education and Research (Wales) Act.

The strategic plan sets out Medr's core strategic aims and commitments, detailing the approach to achieve these objectives. It aligns with the five ways of working in the Wellbeing of Future Generations Act, ensuring that sustainability and long-term thinking guide actions across the education, research and innovation sectors in Wales.

To ensure full ministerial involvement, approval was sought across a range of Welsh Government divisions and Medr will continue to engage with stakeholders throughout the development and delivery process.
